#### Short-term or Degree?

In the next step, you need to decide whether you are going to stay with us as a Degree student or join us temporarily as one of our short-term students with Erasmus, CEEPUS or another international mobility programme

### To your faculty!

Regardless of your previous choice, the page will ask you to choose a faculty. You can do so without any commitment, scroll up and down, switch between the faculties and find everything there is about the programmes we offer.

#### Registration time

All good so far? Perfection! Now it's time to submit your application. You can either register as a new applicant (first time registering) or log into your existing account with your VUTlogin. Registration itself is very simple indeed: just fill in your e-mail address and choose and confirm your password. The only tricky part is this "I'm not a robot" type of question – bud don't fret, you've got this!

#### Who are you?

To carry on with the registration, you have to fill in your personal details, home and mailing address, information about your previous studies answer our short questionnaire. There is also a designated step to consider one's specific needs. You can double-check the data inserted in the final summary

### Time to pay

Your application is in, now is time to settle the money: you can pay either by card or through bank transfer, the whole thing costs 700 CZK or 30 EUR. Once you succeed here, you're in!

For quite some time, Brno has been considered the true centre of the Czech gastro scene and its various bars, restaurants, bistros and cafes are righteously claimed to be the best ones in the whole country.

Every month, we'd like to show you some new interesting places to check out and get a taste of everything that Brno has to offer.

This time we're starting local with our recommendations: there are three tips on where to get the best Czech cuisine experience!

#### 1. Lokál U Caipla (Kozí 115/3)

The real Czech pub with superb Pilsen on tap, placed in the very centre of Brno offers traditional dishes such as goulash, fried cheese (aka smažák), cooked ham hock, olomoucké tvarůžky (traditional Moravian curd cheese delicacy), hot sausages and many many more. Lokál is famous for its wonderful ambience and perfect service and we're absolutely certain you're gonna love it there.

### 2. Pivnice U Čápa (Obilní trh 68/10)

Another place that makes you fall in love with Czech cuisine (and beer) is Pivnice U Čápa: this pub with a tradition of more than 60 years is a place that never disappoints. You can try their zelňačka (classic cabbage soup), home-smoked meats, absolutely divine svíčková (a beef sirloin roast with creamy root veggies sauce and dumplings) or just have a pint and munch on some of their wonderful starters.

**Špilberk Castle** 

Where else to start than in the very centre of our city! Špilberk Castle is one of the two dominants of Brno skyline (the other being St Peter and Paul's Cathedral). It was established in the mid-13th century by the Czech King Přemysl Otakar II. Throughout its history, it served as a royal residence, seat of Moravian margraves, citadel, prison and barracks (in this exact order) and since the 1960s, it's been a seat of the Brno City Museum.

Today you can visit various permanent exhibitions, occasional displays and even former casemates. In the summer months, it hosts plenty of historical shows, concerts and theatre festivals, even now you can, however, climb up the hill and enjoy the breathtaking vista and see all of the city's surroundings.

Another thing not to miss is the castle's park. It's a great place to explore, have a picnic, go on a date or just simply stroll around. On your walks, you can pass the Memorial to Italian Carbonari, Brno's own famous poet Jan Skácel statue and even a herd of goats in the castle garden.

The Little Prince of Eliška Podzimková

We doubt there are many of you not familiar with the story of the Little Prince, a one-of-a-kind masterpiece of the brilliant Antione de Saint-Exupery. Now in Brno, you can experience the legendary classic in a very new way: Moravské zemské muzeum hosts a unique installation, the ingenious work of Czech animator, illustrator and visual artist Eliška Podzimková (@eliskap). The whole experience is magical and Podzimková's creation is a lovely interpretation of the famous Frenchman's book.

The installation works with augmented reality and is interactive out-and-out and — loyal to its original source — has the power to awe anyone regardless of their age.

For our first trip out of the city, we're taking you to the cosy little town of Tišnov. You can get there by train in only about forty minutes and once there, you have a great time ahead guaranteed.

Among Tišnov's main sights, there is the town hall with its sgraffiti walls depicting various scenes from the history of the town, the Church of Saint Wenceslaus and its majestic baroque interior, or an impressive 30 m tall lookout tower.

If you'd like to move your body a bit, you can walk the High Justice Journey – a newly opened track lined with stops to commemorate the seven deadly sins. On a lighter note though, there is the Květnice hil, a double peak reaching altitude 470 above sea level. It's well-known for its karst caves as well as the occurrence of various crystals and gems. For this reason, Tišnov twice a year hosts a mineralogic exhibition where you can see and buy precious stones from all around the world.

And don't worry, Tišnov can accommodate even your belly cravings: you can try local craft beers there, have something to eat in Humpolka Pub or grab a coffee in Ztraceno Café.

# Ladislav Janíček, Rector

"Students are an integral part of the academic community with huge knowledge and social potential. We have been convinced in the past that it is the students who, unbound by conventions and life constraints, are the bearers of active activity and the initiators of change. They have my full support."

Native to Kutná Hora and father of three, Janíček is a truly fascinating persona. The BUT alumni with a specialization in aeronautics engineering, after some time spent in the private sector he switched to academia and became a university educator.

By any means, Mr Janíček's expertise isn't single-oriented. Even though he first started as a mechanical engineer, his interest in economics and management led him to dive into further studies: up to this date, he's gained degrees in mechanical engineering, quality management, business administration and laws.

With his waste knowledge in both engineering, economics and management, he pursued a teaching career – even today he serves as a guarantor of the Air Traffic Economics and Management programme at FME, while he also managed to reach the prestigious post of a university bursar, first at Masaryk University and later here at BUT.

When back at MUNI Janíček managed and supervised the development of their new campus, as well as the reconstruction and remodelling of various MUNI buildings (e.g. Faculty of Arts, Faculty of Education or Faculty of Social Studies residences). The very same approach and drive he applied some time later when he became a bursar of his alma mater BUT.

In 2022 Janíček changed his career direction once again: he took up the position of Rector of BUT.

Among other achievements, Janíček is also responsible for bringing foreign postgraduate degrees (MBA, MPA, LL.M) to the Czech Republic academia and establishing of CEITEC institute in Brno.

In his spare time, Janíček is a sport shooter, arctic explorer and an avid musician. He plays both the piano and organ and also composes: he authored a variety of pieces, some of which opened university galas and other events (and you can also look them up on-line 😉).



Travelling and studying abroad is one of the best life experiences you can give yourself. However, a whole range of administration and paperwork is also associated with it. Some matters are of a more formal nature, but most of them are quite fundamental and it is therefore in your best interest to have them in order from A to Z. One of these things is the visa issue. How to do it - and that it's actually not a science at all - we'll explain in the following text.

Are you a student from a European Union country, or Norway, Liechtenstein, Switzerland or Iceland? In this case, you have in total thirty days after your arrival in the Czech Republic to register with the foreign police (see the contact below). In addition, if you live in university dormitories, the accommodation provider will solve this matter for you. But you don't have to deal with any visa or residence permit.

If you are not from the EU, the deadline for registration with the foreign police is only three days. As in the previous case, these services will be provided by the accommodation provider if you decide to use the BUT dormitory.

Will you stay in the Czech Republic for less than 90 days? Then arrange a <u>short-term visa</u>. For a stay of more than 90 days, it is necessary to obtain a so-called long-term visa, which will allow you to stay in the Czech Republic for up to half a year and whose purpose, in your case, will be to study. On the website of the Ministry of the Interior of the Czech Republic, you will find a detailed description of the entire procedure and possible contacts of competent persons. Info here.

If your stay in the Czech Republic will be longer than six months, you have two options to solve the situation: if the period spent in the Czech Republic is shorter than one year, you just need to extend your visa. However, if you are going to stay in the Czech Republic for more than a year due to your studies, apply for a long-term residence permit. In this case, you need to make an appointment at the Asylum and Migration Policy Department (see the contact below).

Still not sure what type of document you will need? On the BUT website, you will find an interactive questionnaire that will select the most ideal option for you. <u>Take a look here</u>.
